John 3:16 - For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

Verse 24

Jesus cannot be hidden even in the world's darkest places.

Verses 25-27

Jesus prioritizes God's covenant people, Israel, in salvation history.

Romans 1:16 - For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

Luke 19:41 - And when he drew near and saw the city, he wept over it.

Matthew 23:37 - O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!

Romans 11:25–27 - ²⁵ Lest you be wise in your own sight, I do not want you to be unaware of this mystery, brothers: a partial hardening has come upon Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in. ²⁶ And in this way all Israel will be saved, as it is written, "The Deliverer will come from Zion, he will banish ungodliness from Jacob"; ²⁷ "and this will be my covenant with them when I take away their sins."

Verses 28-29

Tim Keller – Parents are not really on the spectrum from cowardice to courage because if your child is inn jeopardy you simply do what it takes to save her.

Matthew 15:28 - Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly.

Jesus extends the kingdom of God to all people groups.

Verse 30
